First Connections Staff are First Responders

First Connections is a **voluntary, free, state-wide** home visiting program that serves over 2,700 families a year in Rhode Island.

First Connections is the **most utilized children's safety net**, and child find entity designed to catch <u>all</u> children under age 3 from falling through the cracks.

The First Connections Program receives thousands of referrals a year to help find and support young children and their families who need to be connected to **life-saving and life-altering supports**. The program ensures that all families receive equitable access to these supports.

Families usually have between one to three (3) culturally competent and thorough home visits conducted by registered nurses, community health workers, and social workers.

First Connections aligns with the state's other priorities. Last year, almost 90% of Rhode Island families with infants exposed to substances were contacted by First Connections, with almost half accepting a visit.

All Rhode Island families enrolled in *First Connections* receive education and counseling on **safe sleep practices**.

Without a Permanent Rate Increase, *First Connections* will End in July 2024!

What are possible outcomes without the First Connections Program?

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- An increase in ER visits for children.
- An increase in longer-term DCYF involvement
- An increase in families needing to rely on DHS benefits long-term
- An increase in developmental delays for children that will not be discovered until pre-k
- An increase in undiscovered and unmitigated lead exposure
- An increase in sleep-related deaths
- An increase in untreated postpartum depression and anxiety among mothers
- An increase in Domestic Violence
- An increase in homelessness



- A decrease in timely pediatric visits
- A decrease in exclusive breastfeeding and/or a decrease in access to formula for newborns
- A decrease in immunizations for children
- A decrease in referrals to Early Intervention
